There have been no contaminants detected in the water supply, however the source is still considered vulnerable to activities located near the drinking water source.

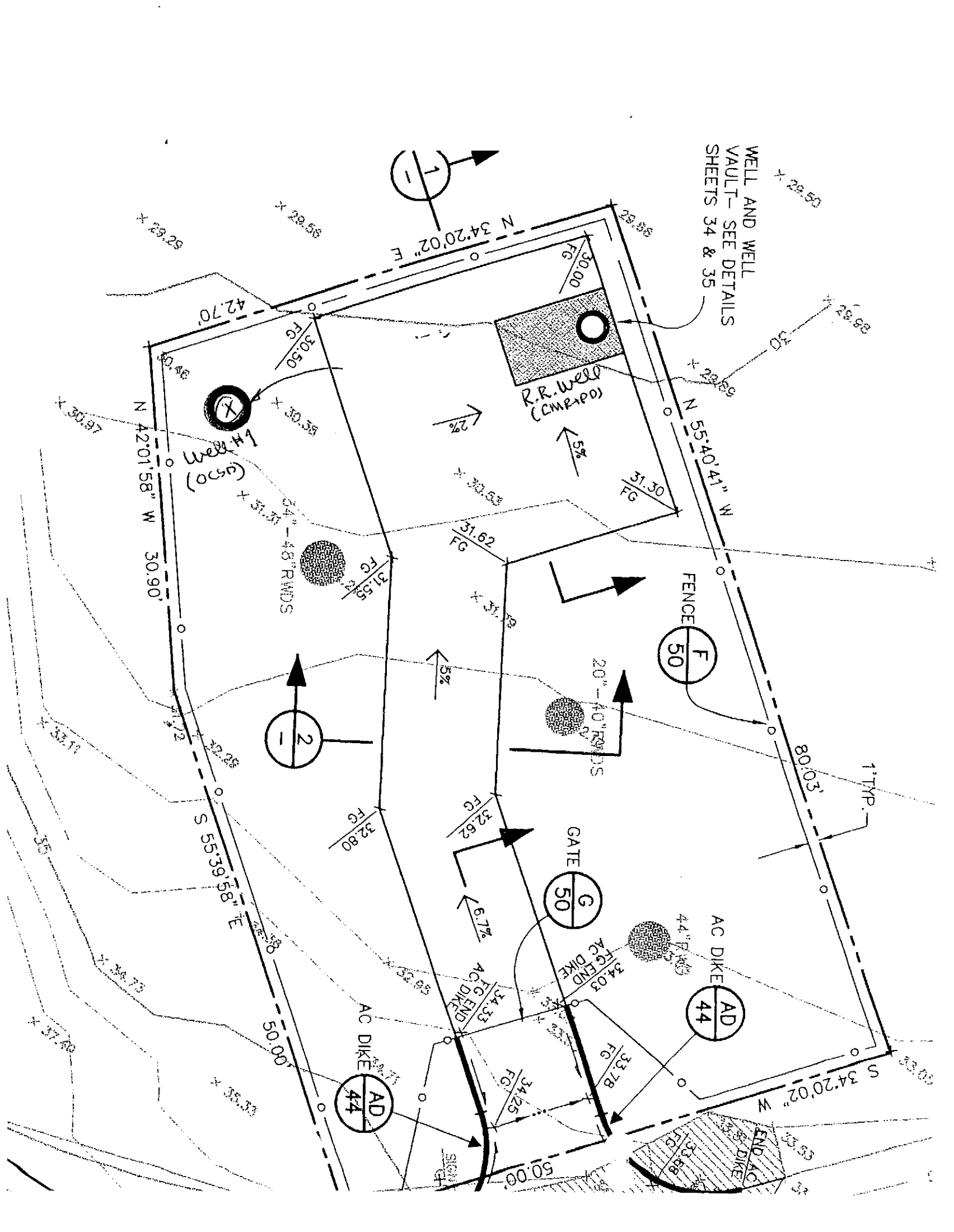

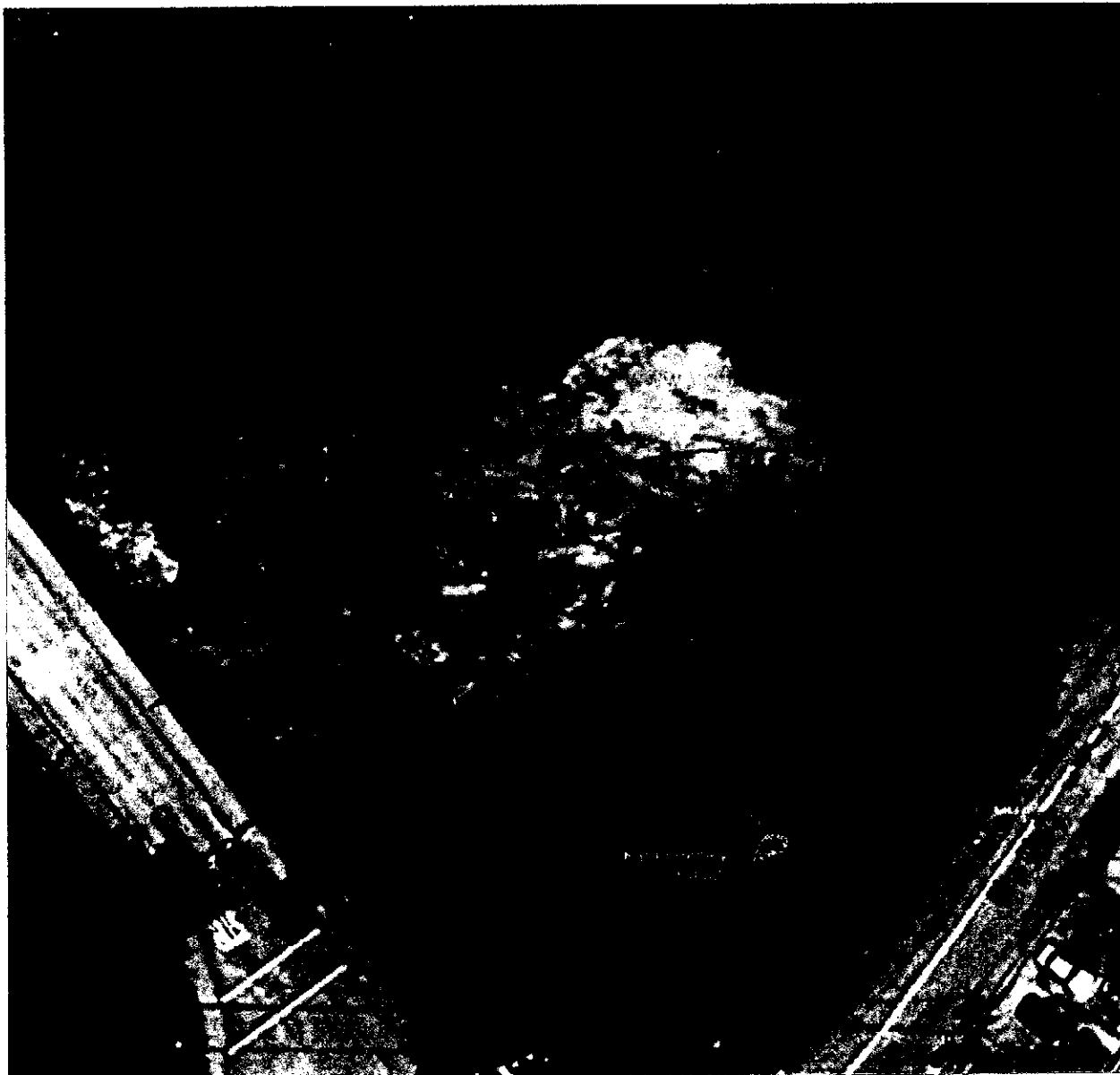

Report to Joint Powers Committee – OCSD / CMRPD

GOAL

Joint effort to insure that OCSD receives water delivery from Monte Rio wells.

FACTS

The total production for both CMRPD & OCSD was 20.4 MG (62.6 ac ft) in 2012.

OCSD received 6.7 MG (20.5 ac ft) from the SCWA (75,000 ac ft pool) in accordance with the CMRPD agreement. This agreement expires June 30, 2014.

CMRPD produced 13.7 MG (42.0 ac ft) of water using permit 21198 (from the 10,000 ac ft pool). This water permit was issued by the Division of Water Rights (DWR) on April 27, 2007.

OCSD BACKGROUND

OCSD signed an agreement with the SCWA on April 23, 2002 for diversion of SCWA-permitted water. The SCWA submitted a "Petition of Change" to the DWR in October 2002 [no follow up?]. The DWR published a "Notice of Change" in March 2007 referring to the SCWA October 18, 2002 petition.

This notice from the DWR was protested by William (Evard) Wadsworth. The SCWA was unable to resolve the protest and later the DWR ordered OCSD to cease using their permitted water (21214) on July 1, 2009.

CMRPD has both a right to use permitted water from the 10,000 ac ft pool and has an agreement to divert water to OCSD using the SCWA-permitted water from the 75,000 ac ft pool. The SCWA/CMRPD agreement terminates June 30, 2014.

The OCSD permit 21214 may be reactivated by the DWR if and when they approve OCSD's recent proposal, which confirms that their water rates are "conservation pricing."

However, this water permit (21214) has a clause which states no water shall be diverted when the flow rate in the Russian River drops below 140 cfs (between November 1 – June 30). Currently, the river flow is less than 140 cfs in May and June.

CONCLUSION

In order to assure a reliable water source for OCSD, the CMRPD must request an extension of the July 9, 1996 agreement including Amendment #3 with the SCWA. If there are any initial or recurring expenses, then OCSD would be obligated to reimburse CMRPD. This commitment may be documents^{ed} with an amendment to the July 8, 2003 Joint Powers Agreement.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Joint Powers Committee be authorized to meet with the SCWA staff to propose an extension to the existing SCWA/CMRPD agreement which expires in 2014.

The OCSD's Engineer, Brelje & Race's Jack Locey met with the SCWA staff in regard to the Russian River County Water District agreement, so he is aware of the various requirements requested by the SCWA.

The attached spreadsheet indicates the projected cost to OCSD.
